Jump height for classes 1 - 12 as per 6^{th} Edition Rulebook 2022 (page 42 rule 6.3.5). Class 12 PTV to be judged under FITE Rules for gaited obstacles.

Competitors at Level 2A / 3 / 4 may be asked to navigate using bearings and / or grid references.

Competitors at Level 3 / 4 may be asked to use historical maps.

Due to the stony ground in the area, barefoot horses may benefit from wearing hoof boots.

Trophies will be awarded to the winner of each class, to be engraved and returned before the 2024 Championships. Rosettes will be presented 1^{st} to 10^{th} place in classes 1-4 and 6-9. Rosettes for Class 5 will be presented 1^{st} to 5^{th} and classes 10-12 will be presented 1^{st} to 6^{th} .

Riders who are under the age of 14 must ride in one of the pairs classes with a partner who is over 18 on the day of the competition. Parents/guardians of competitors under the age of 18 on the day of the competition will be required to complete a Parental Consent Form (available on the TREC GB website: https://trecgb.com/parental-consent-form/).

Special Awards -



The Pagan Prize Donated by Mairi Howat in memory of Pagan and his incredible TREC career. For the highest placed veteran horse, aged 20+.

The Daniel Nolan Trophy – In memory of Daniel Nolan who sadly passed away in 2018 and was a brilliant orienteer and fellow Treccie. For the highest scoring POR in levels 2 - 4.





Sharon Davies Award in memory of Sharon Davies who suddenly passed away in early 2022. Sharon was a keen supporter of TREC giving 100% to organising competitions. She did not have her own horse so hired or loaned a horse and generally competed at L4. For the highest placed rider on a loaned or hired horse.

Nations Cup - Each Nation may nominate between 4 and 8 members of their choice across any or all of the Levels run at the event. Each Nation must have a minimum of 4 team members in order to count. Pairs will be treated as one unit, if within a pair there are two nations, then the pair must nominate which country they will be representing. To be eligible to ride for a Country in the Nations Cup the competitor must meet criteria 1, 2 or 3:

- 1. Resident in that Country
- 2. Born in that Country
- 3. Represented that Country in the past (this is the meaning of 'Grandfather rights')

TREC GB National Championship Qualification Criteria 2023

- Level 1 Competitors who rode at Level 2 and above at the National Championships 2022 may not compete in the Level 1 Newcomer class at the TREC GB National Championships 2023.
- 2. **Pairs** As a qualification for pairs, you must ride with one of the person(s) you have qualified with. You can only ride with that person(s) in the pairs class at each level that you qualified in.
- 3. The 2022 National Championships and Grassroots Championships will carry the same qualifier criteria as all other competitions, for the following year's 2023 TREC GB National Championships.
- 4. **Level 2, 2A, 3 & 4**: In order to be eligible for qualification, riders must be a current Red tier or Blue tier members of TREC GB before the start of the competition at which they achieve a placing as detailed above. In the case of a pair, both riders must be TREC GB members before the competition.
- 5. **Level 1 riders**: Riders must be Red or Blue tier TREC GB members at the time of entering the Championships.
- 6. All classes at the National Championships 2023 will be eligible for points in the Summer League 2023.

- Red or Blue TREC GB members must quote their current TREC GB CLUB membership number as well as their TREC GB membership number.
- Entry fees include corralling and camping fees for Friday 18th, Saturday 19th and Sunday 20th August 2023.
- Tickets for the meal and social event on the Saturday night are not included.

Entries are accepted at the discretion of the organisers.

Entry closing dates - Entries close on Wednesday 2nd August 2023.

Refunds/Withdrawals – Once an application to the TREC GB National Championships 2023 has been accepted:

- A withdrawal before the closing date and acknowledged by phone or e-mail by the Entries Secretary will receive a full refund.
- A withdrawal made between the closing date for entries and the date that start times are due to be published will be refunded, but an administration fee of £20 will be retained.
- A withdrawal made after the start times have been published will not be refunded.
- Where a doctor's or vet's certificate is produced stating that the rider or horse was unable to compete, TREC GB may consider issuing a full refund.
- Refunds will be processed normally within 2-4 weeks after the event.

Equine Flu Requirements: TREC GB requires that all equines must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza and that organisers of any events, involving equines insist that vaccinations are up to date (12-month cycle) and check passports before horses are unloaded. Full details of the TREC GB Equine Flu Vaccination requirements are available on the website (https://trecgb.com/trec-gb-equine-flu-requirements/)

Your horse can be registered on the TREC GB Flu Vaccination Register by sending a copy of the full vaccination record and horse registration details from the passport to admin@trecgb.com. Alternatively, your horse will be registered by the Entries Secretary for this event, please include a copy of the vaccination certificate and horse registration details when sending your completed entry in.

Health Status – TREC GB respectfully ask that if either you or your horse are unwell, exhibiting signs of a temperature, nasal discharge or any other symptoms, please do not attend the event and inform the organiser.

Start Times and Competitor Information - These will be available on TREC GB website on Tuesday 15th August 2023.

TREC GB Team Challenge - Teams of 4 riders, any combination (A pair counts as 2 riders). Entries to be sent to admin before the event or handed to the secretary by 8pm Friday night. Cost £24 per team (BACS, cash or cheque).

Arbitration – Any competitor who wishes to query their scores must do so via the relevant Query form for that phase within the allotted time period as advertised with the provisional scores. Any recourse to an arbitration panel will be dealt with by the Ground Jury on the day

of the Championships, as per TREC GB 6th Edition Rulebook Rule 2.3). No further arbitration will be available following the Championships.

Camping and corralling - Overnight parking and corralling is available on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights at the venue, the cost is included in your entry fee. Please note that you must provide your own electric fencing and energiser (all corrals to be electrified when horses are within them) and your horse and corral must be labelled with your contact details. If your horse is corralled and you are leaving the site, you must organise someone to keep an eye on your horse while you are away and must include this person's contact details on the label too.

Corralling is available on Thursday night and is also included with your entry fee. Anyone wishing to arrive on Thursday night must book in advance via the entry form.

Tents - Tents being used as overnight accommodation must be pitched in the separate area provided for health and safety reasons. Any person found to have pitched a tent in the corralling field will be asked to remove it immediately.

Stabling – 6 stables are available at Kilkenny Farm (a short 5 - 10 minute hack to the venue). Please contact Nick on 07976 240874 (WhatsApp preferred) to book.

Horse Hire – Horses are available to hire from Stoneleigh. Please contact champs@trecgb.com including rider height, rider weight, type of horse you would like and your general experience level by **Saturday 15th July.**

Exercise outriding – strictly only on route available from the secretary's tent.

Toilets and Showers - There will be toilets on site. Showers are NOT available on site.

Water provision - Water for horses will be available in the corralling field. Please bring your own water for human consumption.

Rubbish – The organisers respectfully request all competitors and visitors to the Championships to take their rubbish home with them. No rubbish to be placed into the muck heaps.

Farrier - A farrier will be on call. Their contact number will be in your Competitors Information Pack.

Vet - The local veterinary practice will be on call in case of emergency. Their contact number will be in your Competitors Information Pack.

Feeds - Competitors are advised to bring their own hay/haylage in case grass cover is short. Further information will be in the Competitors Programme. Local feed suppliers are:

The event manager/organiser will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. Competition Rules

All competitors must comply with the TREC GB Rules as per the 6th edition TREC GB rulebook (plus subsequent amendments), which can be found at https://trecgb.com/rules/ In addition, pay particular attention to the following:

- 1. Horses must be a minimum of four years old to compete at Level 1, 2 and 2A and five years old to compete at levels 3 and 4 (i.e. for levels 1, 2 and 2A, a horse born in 2019 may compete in 2023). Mares more than four months pregnant may not compete.
- 2. The welfare of horses competing in British TREC competitions is paramount. No horse may compete if it is unsound or unfit to carry the rider for any reason. Any rider who continues on a horse that they know to be unsound or that has been definitively stopped by the veterinary surgeon or designated competent official on fitness and/ or welfare grounds will be eliminated from the competition.
- 3. All riders competing must be members of a club affiliated to TREC GB or Red Members of TREC GB itself.
- 4. Clearly visible coloured tail wraps/ribbons should be worn to advise other riders of a potential hazard Red = kicker, Green = young/inexperienced horse, Blue = stallion. If the horse/pony is a stallion, then stallion discs must also be worn on both sides of the bridle.

It is your responsibility to familiarise yourself with the basic rules. The TREC GB Rulebook (6th edition issued in 2022 and the changes to it) can be found on the TREC GB website, https://trecgb.com/rules/

Required Equipment

Tack and equipment will be checked. Please see Appendix 3: Equipment List starting on page 62 in the 6th edition TREC GB rulebook.

Safety Helmet Standards

A safety helmet conforming to one of the following standards must be worn, with the chinstrap fastened, at all times when mounted.

The approved standards for British TREC are:

- PAS 015 (2011) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
- VG1 01.040 (2014-12) provided it has a BSI Kitemark OR an Inspec IC Mark
- SEI ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards), providing it has an SEI mark
- SNELL E2016 (or later), providing it has a SNELL label and number

• AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards), providing it has an SAI Global mark Any hat used must conform to one or more of these standards.

Hat cameras

A camera may not be worn on the hat when mounted.

Body protectors

The approved standard for body protectors for British TREC is

• BETA Level 3 (with purple 2009 label or turquoise/ blue 2018 label).

It is recommended that body protectors are replaced every 3-5 years, even if they are apparently undamaged.
